## DETAILED ITINERARY

### Day 1 : Split and UNESCO listed Diocletian Palace



Saturday. Split – Makarska. Hello Croatia and welcome aboard! Located in the heart of Dalmatia, Split became a popular retirement destination in the 4th century for Roman emperors such as Diocletian. Today, it's renowned for its variety of archaeological, historical and cultural monuments, among them the UNESCO listed Diocletian Palace. The first detailed tourist guide published in 1894, bears witness to the long tourist tradition in hospitable Split. Take some time to explore this Roman city - walk the streets

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where the Diocletian emperor once ruled and soak up the important historical sights.

Don't miss the boat! Make your own way to the port, our cruise departs from SPLIT HARBOUR ON SATURDAY AT 13:00. From Split Harbour we cruise south to Makarska. If you require pre-tour accommodation we are able to offer suggestions, get in touch with our travel experts for recommendations.

**Overnight - Makarska - onboard (L)**

### Day 2 : Seafood and spectacular scenery



Makarska – Mljet. Cast your 21st century worries adrift and get on with the business of sheer relaxation and soaking up the sun. Every day there are opportunities to swim and snorkel direct from the boat or from the sandy white beaches as our boat moors in sheltered bays and coves.

Today, we cruise to the Peljesac Peninsula where we will stop to swim. With lunch onboard, we continue to the verdant green island of Mljet. Half of the island is a national park and is stunningly beautiful, with thick green forests of Aleppo pine encircling the two inland salt water lakes. The lakes, Malo Jezero (big lake) and Veliko Jezero (small lake), are interlinked and connected to the sea by a shallow tidal canal. In the middle of Veliko Jezero is the picturesque island of Saint Mary, home to a small 12th century Benedictine monastery, well worth the visit. The island is easy to navigate and it's possible to hire bicycles, motorized scooters, buggies and open top cars from the harbour. At dinner time try one of the many seafood kavarnas (taverns) along the waterfront.

In port at day's end, head to a local restaurant or café. The freshness and variety of Croatian food is typical of Mediterranean cuisine. Seafood has a prominent place, as do fresh vegetables, cheeses and breads. Olives and grapes have been cultivated here since pre-Christian times.

**Overnight - Mljet - onboard (B, L)**

### Day 3 : Explore Dubrovnik



Mljet – Dubrovnik. Arriving into Dubrovnik, spend the day exploring this ancient city. Much of the history of Dubrovnik can be characterised by its intact city walls, which run uninterrupted for 1940 metres encircling the city. This complex structure, one of the most beautiful and strongest fort systems in the Europe, is the main attraction to the city's visitors. Five towers inbuilt along the city wall offer unforgettable views of the city and out to sea, and were once used to ward off invaders.

The old stone city is a labyrinth of criss-crossed cobbled streets and lanes, with a thousand and one taverns serving up cold beer and Mediterranean food, numerous souvenir and gift shops, many days can be spent exploring inside these city walls.

**Overnight - Dubrovnik - onboard (B, L)**

### Day 4 : Sipan Island

Dubrovnik – Sipan Island/Trstenik. This afternoon we cruise to Sipan Island or Trstenik. Trstenik is a pretty harbour town, located on the north eastern tip of the Peljesac Peninsula. The quaint fishing village boasts beautiful unspoiled coves and beaches, fresh water springs and many restaurants and bars along the harbour side strip.

Sipan Island is historically fascinating. During the 15th century it was a chic summer getaway for the very best Dubrovnik families, many

of whom built palaces on the island. Sipan's beaches are never overcrowded so you'll have no trouble finding a pleasant place to leap into the clear sea. **Overnight - Sipan/Trstenik - onboard (B, L)**

### Day 5 : Korcula



Sipan Island/Trstenik – Korcula. Korcula is one of the most charming and romantic islands of the 1000 or so off the Adriatic coast. Korcula old town is set in a mini fortress and reminisces many travellers of Dubrovnik. The distinctive white limestone, which was used to build both towns originates from Vrnika, a tiny island just off Korcula.

Ancient medieval walls surround hidden treasures, where you'll find architectural delights including Renaissance palaces, cathedrals, museums and plenty more gems tucked away in its network of old cobbled streets. According to local legend, the famous world explorer, Marco Polo was born here in 1254 and, you can even climb the tower which was said to be his home. **Overnight - Korcula - onboard (B, L)**

### Day 6 : Pakleni Islands and Hvar



Korcula – Pakleni Islands – Hvar. Today we cruise the Pakleni Islands and onward to Hvar. The tiny archipelago (of about twenty islets) extend along the south side of Hvar. The islands are covered in pine trees and known

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to local fisherman for 'paklina' (melted pine resin), and used for 'water proofing' boat decking. The islands also offer crystal clear waters and secluded beaches.

After lunch on board we cruise onwards to Hvar, an island of sunshine, lavender, sage, rosemary and wine. Take a walk through the harbour town and be sure to sample some of the local wines and spirits, as well as the fresh fish and crustaceans, caught locally.

**Overnight - Hvar - onboard (B, L)**

### Day 7 : Swimming in paradise



Hvar – Brac – Split. We'll cruise to the island of Brac, where we'll stop at famous Zlatni Rat. Known as one of the most beautiful beaches on the Croatian coastline, you can swim in the brilliant blue waters, stroll along the endless stretch of sand or explore the town.

Explore the nearby town of Bol on your own terms before lunch on board. We return to Split for a free afternoon and evening to explore the city at leisure.

### Day 8 : Split

Saturday. Your perfect week of cruising concludes in Split after breakfast.(B)

#### HOTELS

Highlighted below are some of the hotels which we frequently use on this tour, though we reserve the right to substitute these hotels to ones of a similar standard.

**Please refer to your Tour Voucher for your confirmed arrival hotel and further arrival information.**

#### Traditional En suite Ship

Traditional En suite ships offer mostly twin bunk cabin accommodation, though

dependent upon the craft, triple and double-bedded cabins are sometimes available. All cabins on Traditional En suite ships have private en suite bathrooms and air conditioning. Additionally these ships provide towels, plenty of hot water, board games and lots of shaded and sun deck space to relax on.



#### Premium Ship

Premium ships are a class above our traditional ships and are bookable as an upgrade on most sailing trips. The Premium ships are fully renovated, with slightly larger en suite cabins (8 – 14 square metres, twin share or double). All cabins have air conditioning and most common areas do too. Cabins also benefit from hair dryers and safety deposit boxes. Towels and bed linen are changed twice weekly and all premium ships include a tour of Dubrovnik with an English speaking guide. Additionally, premium ships offer plenty of hot water, towels, linen, a TV and sound system in the reception area, board games, WiFi in common areas (when in port) and extensive sun and shaded deck space to lounge about!



#### Premium Plus Ship

Premium Plus ships are recently built mini-deluxe vessels with all the features of our Premium ships but they are larger in size offering ample deck space. Premium Plus ships are used as an upgrade (from Premium) on our cruises and include all of the above plus two more guided tours.



#### Visitor's Tax & Port Fees

Visitor's tax and port fees are not included and must be paid on arrival at a cost of EUR40. The entrance ticket to national parks are not included either and must be paid on arrival. The exact cost is dependent on season and parks visited but costs approximately EUR15 – 17 per person, paid locally.

#### Optional excursions and extras

Below are some optional extras and tours available locally (booked and paid locally in Croatia Kuna only). There are many others and the full list is available on board your ship.

- English breakfast supplement: EUR 40/ person - includes 2 eggs, bacon, tomato and mushrooms, or fruit and yoghurt or similar. Premium and Premium Plus boats include a cooked breakfast.
- Captain's dinner: EUR25/person - your choice of fish or meat menu – prepared in each ship's own style/specialty. A Captain's dinner is included on Premium and Premium Plus boats.
- Extra Towels: Two towels are provided on Traditional Ships weekly. Extra towels can be rented for EUR3 and beach towels EUR5 per week per towel. Katarina Line beach towel can be purchased on arrival for EUR10.

- Daily Cabin Cleaning: EUR15 per person per week - daily cabin servicing, fresh bed linen and towels midweek.

**GAME OF THRONES TOUR IN DUBROVNIK - 2 hours EUR27 per person**

On this tour, you will be taken through all the parts of the Old City where some of the most memorable scenes from the ongoing cultural phenomenon were filmed.

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## Ship and cabin category options

### TRADITIONAL ENSUITE SHIP:

Wooden ship, air-conditioned cabins with private shower/toilet - mostly bunk beds.

**Included services:** Continental breakfasts, three course lunches, water dispenser, complimentary Wi-Fi on board.

### PREMIUM SHIP:

Premium steel hulled vessels with modern traditional look. Accommodation in air-conditioned, spacious en-suite cabins with double or twin beds, hair dryer and safety deposit box. Ships are from 29 to 35m in length with cabins 8 to 14m<sup>2</sup> in size.

**Included services:** Buffet breakfasts, three course lunches, Captain's dinner, English speaking tour manager on board, guided tour in Dubrovnik, daily cabin service, mid-week fresh set of towels and bed linen, luggage handling, olive oil and wine tasting on board, afternoon tea and coffee, water dispenser and complimentary Wi-Fi.

### PREMIUM PLUS SHIP:

Premium superior vessels are recently built mini deluxe vessels featuring similar comfort – 38 to 41m in length. Air-conditioned cabins are 8 to 14m<sup>2</sup> in size with double or twin beds, hair dryer and safety deposit box.

**Included services:** Buffet breakfasts, three course lunches, Captain's dinner, English speaking tour manager on board, guided tours in Dubrovnik, Korcula and Hvar Town, daily cabin service, mid-week fresh set of towels and bed linen, luggage handling, olive oil and wine tasting on board, afternoon tea and coffee, water dispenser and complimentary Wi-Fi.

### 'ON DECK' OR 'BELOW' CABIN:

There are small differences between 'above deck' and 'below deck' cabins. 'Above deck' cabins are arranged on the main or top deck of the boat and have windows allowing fresh air and views. Whilst 'below deck' cabins are arranged within the hull of the boat, below the main deck. 'Below deck' cabins may have port holes, but these will not necessarily open and

if available, can't be opened during cruising times.

## KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

### COVID-19 Vaccination Requirements

As of 01 November 2021 it is a condition of travel, as detailed in our Terms & Conditions that all travellers over 18 years provide proof of COVID-19 vaccination.

We recognise any vaccine that has been authorised for use in the country where the vaccine was administered. This includes vaccines such as AstraZeneca, Covaxin, Johnson & Johnson, Moderna, Pfizer-BioNTech, Sinopharm, Sinovac and Sputnik.

In all instances, you must be fully immunised. This means you must receive the full dosage of the COVID-19 vaccine and allow a minimum of 14 days before travelling in order for immunity to take effect. Each COVID-19 vaccine has different dosages and timeframes for immunisation, so please check the related medical advice associated with your vaccine. Children under 18 years are not required to provide evidence of vaccination to travel at this time.

If you are unable to be vaccinated due to medical reasons, you may apply for an exemption. Exemptions will be assessed on a case-by-case basis. To apply, you must provide supporting documentation from a medical professional.

Proof of COVID-19 immunisation must be provided to us **no less than 4 weeks prior to travel**. We accept COVID-19 digital certificates, NHS Covid Pass or Vaccination Record Cards e-mailed to [info@onthegotours.com](mailto:info@onthegotours.com) or you can upload your vaccination history yourself via our traveller login. <https://www.onthegotours.com/Login>

The information you will need to upload includes: Administering national authority or government, document No, name of Vaccine, date/s of vaccination.

## Our local partner

**This cruise is operated by a trusted partner and you will join travellers who booked through different operators, not solely On The Go.**

## What to pack

Our Croatia cruises are casual and there is no dress code. We recommend packing a comfortable pair of walking shoes and some footwear that is suitable for the beach/sea because the beaches in Croatia are pebbly (not sandy). Casual cotton clothes, sandals, sunscreen, sunglasses, a hat and swimwear are a must. The average temperature during July and August is 28 °C. Be sure to bring some clothing for possible cooler evenings (e.g. a jacket and some trousers) for spring and autumn departures. Fishing equipment, scuba diving masks etc. are available onboard, but in limited quantities. You can bring your own or buy it at places along the route.

## Dietary requirements

The cuisine on board our cruises is a combination of Mediterranean and international cuisine, with traditional Croatian dishes, and includes seafood typical of the region. Please let us know as early as possible if you any dietary requirements to enable the chef to make every reasonable effort to accommodate your dietary needs. If you have not already made us aware of your dietary requirements, please contact us immediately and we will do our best to accommodate your needs.

## Food on board

Food on the vessels is similar to traditional Croatian food. Deluxe Superior, Deluxe, Premium Plus and Premium category vessels include a hot and cold buffet breakfast. Traditional En suite & Traditional category vessels include a continental breakfast which consists of tea and coffee, fruit juice, bread, butter, jam, and eventually ham and cheese. If you want an English breakfast, it is possible pay for it locally.

All Deluxe vessels include four course lunches with drink, all Premium & Traditional vessels have three course lunches. A typical

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lunch could include a starter of home-made soup or pasta and a main course comprising either fish, meat or chicken with a minimum of two sides (potatoes, cabbage, other vegetables), a side salad and dessert. Dessert is often seasonal fruits or perhaps pancakes Dinner is not included because we encourage you to explore local restaurants.

Passengers are not permitted to bring food and drinks aboard the boat. This includes all drinks and food products purchased on shore in ports of call. The only exceptions are personal care products, liquid medicine, food products specifically for infants and food products for special diets. Typical regional products purchased during visits to the ports will be stored onboard and returned to passengers at the end of the cruise.

## Captain's dinner

Once a week there is a "Captain's dinner" on board with a meat or fish menu, which is a chance for guests and the crew to get together. The Captain's dinner is included on all Deluxe and Premium vessels. For Traditional En suite & Traditional vessels the "Captain's dinner" can be booked and paid for locally. The dress code is Smart Casual.

## Drinks on board

A bar operates on board all boats. Prices are in line with those one will pay in port at bars/cafes for beers, wines, basic spirits, mixers, soft drinks and bottled mineral water. Since there is a bar aboard, it is not possible to consume personal supplies of alcohol or beverages not purchased aboard.

Even though the tap water on board is of good quality, we would not recommend you drink it. 1 liter of water is provided per guest per day and further bottles are available for sale on the vessel

Drinks purchased from the vessel bar can be paid in EUR or KN. You will get a daily record of drinks consumed from previous day and can pay for all drinks at the end of the cruise. On all Deluxe and Premium vessel categories you can pay by credit card.

## Electricity & WiFi

Standard European sockets are used throughout Croatia (Type F) - 2 pins, grounded, 16 A, 220 V. Sockets are compatible with plug types - C, E & F.

The ships have free WiFi board but it is not as speedy as you might have at home because it's connected via satellite.

## Families

On occasion family groups, including parents with children may form part of your sailing group. If you specifically do not wish to travel with one or two children onboard, please let us know at time of booking so we can aim to make the necessary arrangements of your request.

## Tipping

We believe that tips should reflect good service and your satisfaction with the guide/cruise manager, crew and overall tour. Crew gratuities are equally distributed among the crew. Tipping is voluntary and completely at your discretion. Your own currency or Croatian Kuna is acceptable.

As a suggestion we recommend that you budget the following -

- Crew (all ship services and assistance with luggage): EUR 5-10 per person per day
- Cruise Manager: EUR 2-5 per person per day
- Local guides (if applicable): EUR 1-2 (10-15 KN per half day of sightseeing)
- Restaurants & Cafes: If not included, tip 10%-15% of the check, depending on the quality of service
- Taxis: Tip up to 10% of the fare (We recommend you book taxis via your tour/cruise manager and pre-negotiate taxi fares to avoid unpleasant surprises at the end of the journey)

Tipping is an entirely personal gesture and ultimately the amount is up to you.

## Currency & payments

Even though Croatia joined the EU in July 2013, the main currency accepted is the Croatian Kuna. Where possible, exchange

your money in a bank or retrieve money from an ATM.

Port fees and visitor's tax (included on Deluxe & Deluxe Superior ships) must be paid locally in cash only (KN or EUR), but all extra services such as transfers, excursions, drinks on board can be paid in local currency KUNA or by credit card (Visa or MasterCard). Please note that it is not possible to pay by credit card on traditional and traditional en-suite category ships.

Most major towns and islands in Croatia such as Opatija, Dubrovnik, Split etc. will have ATMs that are linked to international networks; however, smaller towns may not have ATM facilities available. Credit cards such as Visa and MasterCard are widely recognised and are accepted in most tourist areas; however, it is always wise to have a small amount of cash if you are travelling off the beaten path.

## Captain's call

The captain has the right to change the scheduled route at any point in time to ensure the safety of all travellers and to ensure the cruiser stays on schedule. Changes may become necessary due to weather, sea conditions, port regulations or any other reason.

Please note that all boats have an onboard motor which they tend to use for the majority of the time, rather than the sails.

## Smoking

Smoking in the restaurant area and in the cabins is not allowed. Smoking is permitted on deck but passengers must not throw cigarette butts in the sea.

## Croatia Country Guide

### Visas and passports

Visa requirements are subject to change and visa procurement is the responsibility of the traveller and not On The Go Tours. Visa requirements are subject to change, therefore it is essential that you check current visa requirements with the Croatian Embassy before travel. For information about visas,

Please also ensure that your passport is valid for at least 6 months from your planned date of departure from Croatia.

After booking your holiday, please provide us with your passport details as soon as possible so that we can proceed to book all services.

## Essential packing

Please check local temperatures so you can pack accordingly. Visit [www.worldclimate.com](http://www.worldclimate.com)

- Lightweight cotton garments in summer, warm clothing for Spring and Autumn (temperatures can get quite low at night)
- Comfortable walking shoes
- Universal travel adaptor
- DEET based mosquito repellent and antihistamine cream
- First aid kit including Dioralyte
- Tour Voucher and a copy of your travel insurance policy, spare passport photos and a photocopy of your passport
- Sunglasses, hat, sunscreen, swim costume, torch and money belt
- Either a rucksack or suitcase is suitable. A small daypack for your day-to-day needs
- A towel for swimming/showering (unless stated as included under the Trip Notes 'Inclusions' section on page one of these Trip Notes)

## Health requirements and water

You should seek medical advice for vaccinations and about medications before travelling.

The tap water in Croatia is generally considered safe to drink, but as a precaution against stomach upsets you may want to drink bottled mineral water, which is readily available from shops, hotels and restaurants.

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
