

# Galilee to The Dead Sea

8 days | Starts/Ends: Tel Aviv



*Starting in Tel Aviv, spend 8 days taking in the highlights of Israel, from the famously buoyant Dead Sea and the holy cities of Jerusalem and Nazareth, to the Sea of Galilee and Mount Carmel in Haifa and Caesarea on the Mediterranean coast*

## HIGHLIGHTS AND INCLUSIONS

### Trip Highlights

- Tel Aviv - explore this cosmopolitan city and the ancient port of Jaffa
- Masada – take a cable car up to the ancient fortification of Masada and enjoy unrivalled views over the Dead Sea
- The Dead Sea – float in the famously buoyant, mineral-rich waters
- Jerusalem New City (West Bank) - admire incredible views of the Old City from Mount Scopus, see the Dead Sea Scrolls in the Israel Museum and visit the world Holocaust remembrance center
- Jerusalem Old City (West Bank) - explore the sacred sites of the Old City including the Wailing Wall, the Church of the Holy Sepulchre and Via Dolorosa
- Bethlehem (West Bank) - visit the Shepherd's Field, Church of the Nativity and Manger Square

- Beit Shean - take in the excavations of this beautifully preserved Roman city
- Nazareth - see the Church of the Annunciation and other holy sites
- Safed - visit a synagogue and the beautiful streets of the artists' colony in the city of the Kabbalah
- The Wine Region - learn about wine production on a tour of a vineyard and sample fine wine
- Sea of Galilee - visit the site of the 'Sermon on the Mount' and the 'Miracle of the loaves & fish' in Capernaum and Tabgha
- Acre - roam around the old Crusader stronghold and medieval fortifications
- Haifa - walk through the beautiful terraces of the Bahai Gardens, set on the slopes of Mount Carmel, and see the UNESCO listed Bahai Shrine
- Caesarea - discover Roman and Crusader-era ruins in one of the great cities of antiquity

## ITINERARY

### Day 1 : Tel Aviv

Sunday. Upon arrival at the airport you will be met and transferred to your hotel in Tel Aviv. Rest of the evening is free. **Overnight - Tel Aviv**

### Day 2 : Masada Fortress & The Dead Sea

Tel Aviv - Beer Sheba - Masada - Dead Sea - Jerusalem (West Bank). Set off from Tel Aviv, and drive south past the cities of Ashdod and Ashkelon to the Negev capital of Beer

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Sheba. After a short visit, continue via Arad to the Masada Fortress which sits atop an isolated rock cliff and was the last stronghold of the Jewish Zealots in their war against the Romans. Ascending by cable car to the fortress offers incredible views of the Dead Sea and at the top explore the excavations of Herod's Palaces, the synagogue and the bathhouse. Later descend to the lowest place on Earth to float in the famously buoyant, salt-laden water of the Dead Sea. From the Dead Sea journey to Jerusalem, passing by the oasis of Ein Gedi and the Judean Desert en route. Spend the evening at leisure.

## Day 3 : Jerusalem New City



Today's sightseeing tour of Jerusalem New City starts with a drive to Mt Scopus for a wonderful panoramic view of Old City, before continuing on to the Garden of Gethsemane and the Church of All Nations at the foot of the Mount of Olives. Next stop is the Israel Museum which houses The Dead Sea Scrolls in the Shrine of the Book. Then visit the beautifully renovated Model of the Herodian city of Jerusalem, which dates back to the time of the Second Temple. The next stop on our tour of the New City is Yad Vashem, the world Holocaust remembrance centre.

This afternoon visit the the picturesque village of Ein Karem, which is the birth place of John the Baptist. Then travel to Downtown Jerusalem to explore bustling Mahane Yehuda, which is Israel's largest open market.

## Day 4 : Jerusalem Old City & Bethlehem

Step back in time on a tour of Jerusalem's revered Old City today. Enter through one of

the Gates to the walled Old City, to visit the renewed Jewish Quarter, the Western Wall (aka the Wailing Wall), the Temple Mount and the colourful souk. Then walk along the Via Dolorosa, stopping at the Stations of the Cross en route to the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. The Church of the Holy Sepulcher is one of the world's holiest Christian shrines and the site of Jesus' crucifixion and burial. Continuing your tour, visit Mt Zion and the tomb of King David, the Room of the Last Supper and Dormition Abbey.

This afternoon drive to Bethlehem to visit the birthplace of Jesus at the Church of the Nativity before returning to Jerusalem for the night. **Overnight - Jerusalem (B, D)**

## Day 5 : Beit Shean, Nazareth & Safed

Beit Shean - Nazareth - Safed - Galilee. Bid farewell to Jerusalem and drive north past Jericho, which is considered to be the world's oldest city. Travelling through the Jordan Valley and the new settlements to Beit Shean, see the excavations of this beautiful preserved Roman city before continuing on to Nazareth to visit the Church of Annunciation and other Christian holy sites. Final stop of the day is Safed, city of the Kabbalah and centre of Jewish mysticism, where you'll visit a synagogue and explore the beautiful streets of the artists' colony. Your home for the next two nights is a kibbutz hotel in Galilee.

## Day 6 : Golan Heights & the Sea of Galilee



Driving to the Golan Heights, visit the former Syrian fortifications and the Druze villages, passing Banias, the source of the Jordan River. Then enjoy a tour of the Israeli wine

country, visiting picturesque vineyards where you can take in the wonderful views, learn about wine production and sample fine wines.

Descending to the shore of the Sea of Galilee take a tour of the Miracle Sites. In Capernaum visit the ruins of the ancient synagogue, the Mount of Beatitudes - site of the 'Sermon on the Mount' and Tabgha - site of the miracle of the loaves and the fish. Then travel on to Tiberias, the old centre of Jewish learning. This afternoon there is also an optional sailing trip across the Sea of Galilee to experience the tranquillity and beautiful scenery which has hardly changed in the past 2000 years (book and pay locally). Then return to your kibbutz hotel for the night. **Overnight - Galilee (B, D)**

## Day 7 : Acre, Haifa, Caesarea & Tel Aviv



Galilee - Acre - Haifa - Caesarea - Tel Aviv. After breakfast drive through the hills of the Galilee, westwards to Acre, where you'll explore this old, Crusader stronghold and its medieval fortifications. Continue to Haifa, the largest city in northern Israel which dates back over 3000 years. Sightseeing here includes the UNESCO world heritage listed Bahai Shrine and the magnificent gardens on the slopes of Mount Carmel which are spread over 19 terraces, the highest of which is the Persian Gardens where you can enjoy the wonderful panoramic view of the city and Haifa Bay.

Travelling down the coast to reach Caesarea, visit the Roman Theater and Crusader fortress at what is known as the "masterpiece of Herod the Great". Then continue your journey to Tel Aviv and end the day with a short city

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tour of Tel Aviv and the ancient port of Jaffa.

## Day 8 : Tel Aviv

Sunday. Arrangements come to an end after breakfast and onward transfer to airport. Alternatively extend your stay to enjoy more time in cosmopolitan Tel Aviv. (B)

### HOTELS

### Hotel Metropolitan
